

# UC Small Business First Program UC Merced Campus Purchasing Process

This program does not apply to transactions funded in whole or in part by federal funds

#### 1. Overview

The Small Business First (SBF) Program is a 'set-aside' program that provides contracting and procurement opportunities for certified Small Businesses (SB) using an informal solicitation process rather than formal bidding.

All UC contracts and procurements **between \$10,000 to \$250,000** must be awarded to a SB, wherever practicable. Review the transactions types that are <u>exempt from the SBF Program</u> (no waiver required).

# 2. Requirements

If the transaction is subject to the SBF Program, the following is required:

A.	Transactions below \$100,000 (annually):  ☐ One quote from a certified small business or refer to section 3. Waiver
В.	Transactions \$100,000 - \$250,000 (annually):   Two or more quotes from a certified small business or refer to Section 3. Waiver
	$\square$ If the higher quote is selected, a justification is required
	Source Selection Price Reasonableness Form (SSPR) Form
C.	All Transactions:  Documentation verifying that the supplier is a small business (i.e. screen print)

### All other required documentation based on the type of transaction

3. Waivers

A waiver may only be submitted for a transaction that is subject to the SBF Program in the event that:

Refer to the <u>sample list of acceptable certifications</u> for this program.

- At least two (2) certified SBs are not available (\$100,000 & over);
- Business needs that dictate requirements that cannot be met by a certified SB; or
- Similar situation

## **Waiver Process:**

- A. A completed and signed <u>waiver form</u> must be attached to the requisition with the required supporting documents for Campus Purchasing approval.
- B. Waivers may only be approved by UCLA Campus Purchasing Senior Buyers, Commodity Managers and Management.
- C. Prior to approving a waiver, confirm the goods and/or services cannot be provided by a strategically-sourced agreement.
